

Discussion was held about when to have the next meeting. The next meeting will be in October. Watch the newsletter for more information.



MUIRHEAD SPRINGS FOREST PRESERVE 2018

FIRST RECREATIONAL SPRING DRIVE

HUB Club Spring Recreational Drive was held at Muirhead Springs Forest Preserve on June 2. The weather cooperated as it was only overcast most of the day with temperatures between the high 60's and low 70's, near perfect weather conditions for a cart drive.



Muirhead Springs forest preserve in Kane County encompasses 797 acres of farmland returned to prairie. At one time this forest preserve was two farms, the Norris farm makes up the far east side and the Muirhead farm the west.

This forest preserve has two trails the Grand Prairie Trail and the East Cut-



over Trail. Both trails are limestone screenings.
Using the two trails participants were given
four different drive patterns: 4.09KM (2.54M)
Short trail; 5.39KM (3.35M) Medium-Short trail;
6.20KM (3.85M) Medium trail; and a 7.14KM
(4.44M) Long trail. The longest distance drive
incorporated both Grand Prairie and East Cutover trails, while the medium trail used the
Grand Prairie Trail only.

Throughout the course lettered posts marking strategic locations to aid the navigators in determining the horse's performance in meeting the target times. Detailed maps with distance guides were provided to each team. This was not an official marathon since there wasn't a vet check before and after the drive.

All participants were at training level for the marathon. Two horses and one pony participated. Tammy Carlo entered her Morgan horse Hershey in the long trail marathon (7.14KM) along with Linda Fidler and her warmblood the .

horse Northern Lights Reign. Krista Ziec chose the medium trail (6.2KM) marathon for her POA pony Lily. Grace Frolich-Grubb brought her very small Shetland pony Rhianna for a short walk as this was the pony's first time out this year and first time at Muirhead Springs.

Our volunteers at this year's event were Bob Mikos in charge of parking and directing traffic, Sue Payne working as the time keeper, Mary Thompson the starter and running the video

camera and our spotters Bev Bauer and Evelyn Hickey. Armed with walkie talkies, the volunteers took to their assignments and were ready for the first driver.

Taking the Grand Prairie trail in clockwise direction, Reign moved slowly down the first hill and past the first spotter. This team would drive the Long Trail (7.14 KM), Reign was determined to enjoy the view and smell the flowers!

About 13 minutes later, Krista and Filip had Lily at the starter box and moved on out to drive the Medium Trail (6.2KM) at 10:29:30. Krista was determined to have Lily meet the target of 27 minutes and 37 seconds. Lily was determined to meet that goal as she moved on too fast for the first spotter Evelyn to get a photo!

Hershey was harnessed and ready to go at 10:44:12. Tammy and Chris made sure they were all ready to go since this is Chris's first year as navigator. Tammy has Hershey driving the long trail (7.14M) also determined to make their target of 29 minutes and 36 seconds. This time the spotter Evelyn was ready to take a photo as the team trotted down the hill

In general, the drive along the trail was clockwise except for those on the Long Trail. To get the distance the team had to take the East Cut-over Trail and move counter-clockwise on the Grand Prairie Trail until they got back to the East Cut-over Trail head and continue in a clockwise direction.

Reign's team was moving counter-clockwise on the Grand Prairie Trail as Lily's team competing on the Medium marathon trail was driving clockwise. Linda Fidler commented, "Wow that Lily is fast, makes Reign look pretty slow!" they passed each other with no incident, however Reign decided to pick up her trot with a lot more enthusiasm. The two teams would see each other near the intersection of the two trails.






No sooner had Reign's team got back to their trailer, team Hershey would come in strong. Sue Payne timed them out at 11:12:55. Tammy drove Hershey in 28 seconds and 43 seconds, only 7 seconds off the target of 28 minutes and 36 seconds! After getting the horses and

After getting the horses and ponies settled it was time for lunch and the third HUB Club meeting at the shelter. Of course, the wind did pick-up and it cooled off more while we all sat under the open shelter, but the food brought for pot luck was good and there was plenty of deserts!

The marathon was fun and challenging, but if you came for just a recreational drive and not to compete there was plenty around to feast your senses. Even though there was a late Spring this year, the meadows were filled with early spring flowers. Besides the usual dandelions, there were purple spider's wart everywhere along with flowering clover, wild daisies, milk weed and a variety of other flowering plants indigenous to the Illinois prairies.



In the meantime, Hershey's team was coming too, so Reign's team needed to get a move on! Hershey had a nice steady trot going on and since Reign left the start box 27 minutes before Hershey, it didn't look like Reign was going to meet the target of 29 minutes and 36 seconds. Her strategy was to not return in a sweat!

The second spotter Bev radioed to the starters that Lily's team was on their way. Mary got the video of Lily appearing over the last hill, still moving quickly as Sue Payne wrote down the finish time of 10:58:31. Krista was pleased with marathon time of 29 minutes and 1 second, only

24 seconds over the allowed time of 28 minutes 37 seconds (target was 1 minute less).

About 2 minutes later, Reign was spotted by Bev and the volunteer team were ready. Reign clocked in at 11:11:21. Reign trotted most of the way up the hill but that last stretch to the finish was at a casual walk as she was anticipating a reward of fresh grass to eat. Team Reign completed the 7.14 KM marathon in just under an hour, 54 minutes and 24 seconds, (only 23 minutes and 38 seconds over the allowed time). Lydia and Linda remarked, "We enjoyed the drive, the flowers were beautiful!"



Besides the flowers and numerous grass types (Reign's favorite treats at the forest preserves), there can be heard and often seen various species of birds. Muirhead Springs is a favorite spot for bird watchers. The meadows are filled with







with meadow larks, red-wing blackbirds, Orios, red tailed hawks, pheasants, swallows, killdeers, the occasional group of wild turkeys and even turkey vultures flying overhead (so look alive!). Take the time out and just come for a pleasant drive at Muirhead Springs. More details about this forest preserve can be found on the Kane County Forest Preserve Website.



Patricia "Trish" Demers owns and operates Carpe Diem Farm in Prescott Valley, Arizona, the home of the "happy horse." Trish is a trainer, clinician, judge, evaluator, instructor, course designer, and can appraise carriage, harness, and turnout. Working with beginning drivers (and riders) is her specialty, whether the discipline is combined driving, pleasure driving, or recreational driving, for show or for fun. In fact, she stresses SAFETY and FUN when she educates, and the farm motto is: "Try Hard, Win Humbly, Lose Gracefully."

Dear Kris:

Thank you, and whoever suggested it, for printing Andy Marcoux's "Blinders or Not" article in the April Wheel to Wheel. It could not have come at a better time for me. My otherwise wonderful horse has always been nervous about hitching in public places. Her nervousness resulted in her bolting while hitched at last year's Blackhawk Ridge DDC drive. After that, I felt that we were never going to be safe enough to participate in shows or group trail drives again.

Over the winter, I started to consider whether driving her in an open bridle might alleviate our problem because one of the contributing factors to her breakaway at Blackhawk Ridge was that she could hear but not see what was coming towards her from behind. Since she was initially trained to drive in an open bridle, I didn't think she would have any trouble adjusting. I only transitioned to a closed bridle in the first place because, at the first driving show we went to, the judge publicly ridiculed me for driving in an open bridle. Shame on him. So my plan was to hitch her in her riding bridle and test my hypothesis.

After reading Andy Marcoux's article, I decided more caution might be advised. I started casting about for a trainer but could think of no way to easily involve a trainer given our location, logistics, etc. So I decided to work through the steps suggested in the article myself. Fortunately for me, it only took two sessions of ground driving and one session of dragging the cart behind her--none of which fazed her--to give me the confidence to hitch and drive her in the open bridle. i discovered I could easily remove the blinkers on my driving bridle and replace them with open cheeks at a very nominal cost. So the two of us are now driving in an open bridle.

I have not yet tested whether this will improve hitching away from home but I am optimistic because she feels calmer. An unexpected benefit of driving with an open bridle is that I no longer worry about her running into things she can't see. If she ever again bolts without me, at least she will be able to see where she is going and be safer for it. Plus reducing my worry level, reduces hers.

So thank you for printing the article. It gave me helpful tips and the push to try an open bridle.

The decision to use the "Blinders or not" article was totally mine......

Al and I train all of our horses in an open bridle at first.

Our first horse was petrified of a closed bridle. We had plain cheeck pieces made for her over 30 years ago. She worked calmly in an open bridle.

We watched a friend and her Appaloosa be berated at an ADS show for not driving in winkers..... I got the rules and had a heated discussion with both the judge and the TD over it.....The ADS DOES NOT require winkers.....in fact, Artillery horses drive in open bridles with rattling cannons behind them.... Our friend was so rattled that she never showed at a driving show again. But, she continued to enjoy her lovely Appy as a pleasure driving horse for many years.

I am very glad that the article was of help..... Kris Breyer
