ENJOY DRIVING THROUGH THE WOODS AND FIELDS?

Like to move at your own pace and not be locked into a pace by the vehicle in front of you? Like the challenge of following a course that's not "straight lines" with a couple of curves or angles? Want to get a few miles work without going around and around or back and forth?

Enjoy the "pie plate" challenge of following of following the course. Much easier than using a map that you have trouble viewing while driving Consider participating in **MDDA** (Midwest Distance Driving Assoc.) drive. They're in Illinois and Wisconsin; plus other neighboring states. Great as a first time try, or for the horse that is not really in condition."Vetted" trails that are definitely drivable & marked. Drivers leave at 5 minute internals. You have a feeling of being alone; but, someone is close if there is a problem.

"Stagecoach Mary" Fields was the first African American woman hired by the U.S. Postal Service.

She won the job in 1895, at age 60, by being the fastest to hitch up a six-horse wagon team. Fields stood 6 feet (182 cm) tall and weighed about 200 lbs (90 kg), liked to smoke <u>cigars</u>, and was once said to be as "black as a burnt-over prairie (black)." She usually had a pistol strapped under her apron and a jug of whiskey by her side. Mary carried mail in Cascade, Montana, for almost a decade. She was born a slave and was respected even after her death. Her hometown declared her birthday a holiday. She was called White Crow because she lived like a free woman. Her best friend was a nun she grew up with when she was on their plantation in the South. When she wrote to say she needed her at the mission, she joined her and worked and protected the nuns and children a long time. She was also well-known for her prowess with a rifle! She was a master of life.




