tricks too. Hope to see you all there. **Ann**



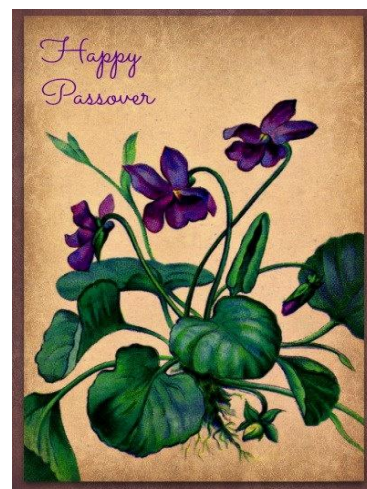

**Virtual Events** – Committee is still looking for ideas. We are looking at doing a Zoom meeting for CAA Proficiency.

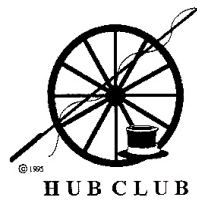
**Affiliate Members** – We are now Affiliate Members of both CAA and ADS.

# A Clinic with Patricia “Trish” Demers

- The clinic will be held at the Fox Valley Saddle Association, 44W300 Rohrsen Rd., Hampshire, IL, which has an indoor arena, outdoor arena, and outdoor grass field for cones and obstacles, weather permitting. All levels and disciplines welcome!
- Private lessons are \$120, payable to HUBClub. Refunds for cancellations will only be given if the slot can be filled.
- **There will be at least two people available for scheduling official ADE pony and VSE measurements.** There is no fee to HUBClub members for these measurements.
- **Trish is available to evaluate for CAA Level 1 Driver Proficiency including the Road Test.** Contact Lydia for more info.
- Per our insurance and bylaws, anyone actively involved with a horse at the clinic must be a HUBClub member. This includes drivers, grooms, certain volunteers, and anyone bringing a pony or VSE for measurement.
- Participants may clinic out of their trailer for a daily haul-in fee of \$10 or out of a permanent stall for a daily stall fee of \$25 (add \$10 if coming in the night before). Electrical hook-ups for overnight camping are also available upon special request. Bedding is not included and is NOT available for purchase on-site. Everyone is kindly asked to clean up after their horse when they leave whether hauling-in or using a stall.
- Anyone riding on a carriage must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use.
- A negative Coggins test dated within one year of the event is required. Out-of-state horses must present a Veterinary Health Certificate dated within 30 days of clinic.
- There are bleachers outside but your own chairs may be more comfortable. A hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, and bug spray are also recommended.
- Each person should bring their own lunches, drinks, and snacks. If the weather is nice, bring chairs and eat outside! Otherwise, as long as everyone maintains social distancing, we can eat in the clubhouse. Dinner TBD.
- No dogs allowed.
- We will be following the current State of Illinois/Kane County COVID-19 guidelines on the date of the clinic.

# Getting to Know You... Al & Kris Breyer

**Growing up:** Al and I were both born and grew up on the South side of Chicago.

**Education:** I went to St. Ailbe's Grade School and St. Francis de Sales High School. Al went to St. Basil's Grade School and De La Salle High School. We both received our bachelor's degrees from UICC. I got my master's from NEIU and some work at Loyola of Chicago.

**Family:** Al is an only child. I have a younger brother and much younger sister.

**Previous employment:** Al worked for many years in the Financial Legal field and as a Bankruptcy specialist. I taught the Sciences and Math at a couple of inner City referral high schools and suburban High schools.. Then I managed a Nature Museum for around ten years.

## Today:

**My most vivid memory while driving:** Representing the Sport of Driving and the Morgan breed at Equitana twice with one of our pairs.

**I struggle some days (driving related):** Al to quit grinning while he drives. I don't get to drive very often, but I struggle with hand numbness.

**My favorite thing to do with my horse(s):** Have a good time with whatever we do with them...

**It's really interesting to:** Watch our horses learn.

**Any day we're:** Upright is a good day at our age!

**I'd like to see Hub Club:** Have more events.

**My future plans include:** Showing again soon. Al is pumped to drive his homebred four-year-old this year. Al & I were just honored by the Lake County Board and Forest Preserve District for our volunteer services with a plaque and proclamation. Al for 30 years and myself for 35 years. We were honored at the Lake County Board meeting in March. I have just retired from the American Morgan Horse Assn. BOD and was honored by being given the honorific of Emeritus. I will still be head several Competition committees and dressage scholarship committees.



Al and his first cart in 1980 after a show, driving my 18 year old former Morgan park stallion, Fashion Stacked Deck. Decker rode western (pleasure and stock horse), saddle seat, hunt seat, jumper, did parades, did historical re-enactments, trail horse, in hand, showmanship...

We helped design the harness based on a Hermes one. This was our first attempt at designing harnesses.

The cart is a racetrack breaking cart with heavy cast metal fittings and heavy pipe shafts. It started with a tractor type seat. It was around 40 years old when we got it.

This is our first carriage vehicle, a Houghton #10 whose pattern dates to the early years of the 20th Century. Ours was built in 1984. The Morgan mare is our homebred and carriage trained BPM Blazing Star. She was Top Four in the World Western Pleasure as a Four-year-old, did trail rides and showed in hunter pleasure and lower levels ridden and driven dressage.



Same vehicle in 2017 with the five-year-old Merriehill Worth the Wait in his first carriage class. Cosmo also showed Classic Pleasure Driving, western pleasure and hunt seat. He is now a junior Exhibitor ridden Dressage horse. He is shown below in a Houghton Show cart also built in 1984.

Merriehill Angel Dust in the Show Cart. She rides Hunt seat and dressage as well.



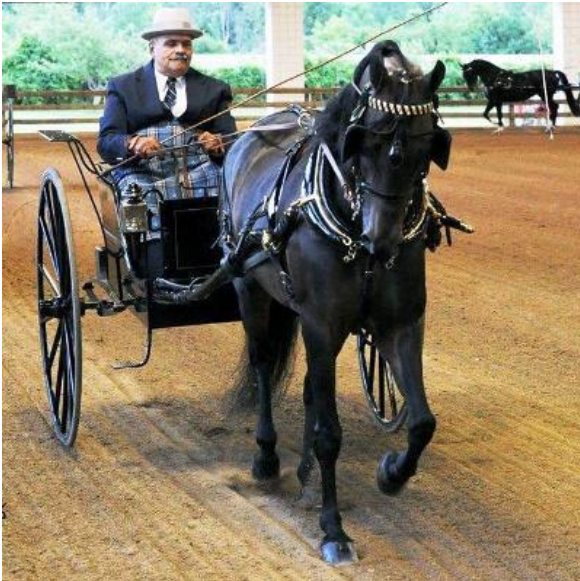
We also drove pairs for many years. We had four mares we drove in various configurations over the years....This combination is BPM Fleur de Lis on the off side, and Barr's Lucky Lady on the near side. Our pairs were World and National Champions in 1992, and many years were AMHA Open Competition Champions. These two mares also showed under saddle, Dressage ridden and driven and CDEs.





A. T. Demarest Wicker Phaeton circa 1870 we had restored by Tucker's Carriage House in Landrum, SC. early in 2004. The wicker is original to the vehicle and was conserved and restored by Dennis Madsen of Wilmette, IL in 2005. The harness is by Smucker. The Morgan mare is one of our home bred and trained, BPM Prairie Lily.

Below is a Village cart with adjustable seat we bought around 2008. The Morgan mare Merriehill Angel Dust is seen hitched to it in both a breastcollar and patenet full formal collar.



Al is driving Merriehill Angel Dust to a Goddard type buggy restored by Ernie Schwartz of Shipshewana, IN around 15 years ago. The Goddard buggy was considered a top doctor's buggy in the late 1800's by American East Coast doctors and was even advertized in JAMA.



## Five Top Tips For Feeding Your Horse For Show Ring Success



### Condition

If your horse needs to gain or lose weight before his first show, the earlier you alter his diet to achieve this, the better. Use a weighttape and Body Condition Scoring to monitor progress and aim for a horse who is fit and moderately conditioned, not fat. Weight loss is probably harder to achieve than weight gain so allow extra time for this and use the tail-end of the winter to your advantage by only using lightweight rugs so the horse has to burn some body fat to keep warm.

### Top Line

To build muscle and top line, your horse's diet must contain the right nutritional building blocks, primarily good quality protein. Look for soya and alfalfa as protein sources and buy the best quality feed or balancer you can afford. You must then feed it at the recommended levels to ensure the overall diet is supplying all that your horse needs, including the essential amino acids to build and repair muscle and other tissue. This is likely to give you more cost effective results than adding an expensive specialist supplement to an existing deficient diet.

### Coat Shine

True healthy coat shine comes from within not from a bottle! Before adding oil or linseed to your horse's diet, however, check that the overall diet is fully balanced by ensuring you are feeding an appropriate feed or balancer at recommended levels. Vitamins and minerals play lots of key roles in the body, not least in promoting healthy supple skin. To gain that extra head-turning gloss, consider a specially formulated high oil supplement, like Baileys Outshine, which contains a blend of Omega oils as well as supporting antioxidants to help the body utilise the oils effectively.

### Fibre Maintenance

If the stress of travelling and competing starts to put your horse off his feed or forage, it's particularly important to maintain fibre intake to support gut health. Offer damp hay or haylage, while travelling, and consider alternative fibre sources in the stable, especially if staying away from home. Soaked Speedi- or Fibre-Beet or Alfalfa Blend and other chaffs, can be offered in separate buckets, alongside hay and/or haylage, to encourage the horse's natural foraging behaviour. Consider adding a prebiotic, like Baileys Digest Plus, to the feed too, to support the fibre-digesting bacteria in the hind gut.

### Hydration

A horse loses electrolyte salts whenever it sweats and these need replacing in order to help the body rehydrate and recover from exertion. Giving a good quality electrolyte supplement, such Baileys Aqua-Aide, in water or wet, sloppy feed, each time a horse sweats, is advisable, whether at home or at a show. To encourage a horse to take electrolytes and drink at a show, mix them with a handful or two of soaked beet or an alfalfa chaff and add enough water to make a soup-like, drinkable consistency. Always offer fresh clean drinking water as well as electrolyte water/feed and ensure fibre intake is maintained as this acts as a reservoir for water and electrolytes in the horse's hindgut.
