- The clinic will be held at the Fox Valley Saddle Association, 44W300 Rohrsen Rd., Hampshire, IL, which has an indoor arena, outdoor arena, and outdoor grass field for cones and obstacles, weather permitting. All levels and disciplines welcome!
- Private lessons are \$120, payable to HUBClub. Refunds for cancellations will only be given if the slot can be filled.
- **There will be at least two people available for scheduling official ADE pony and VSE measurements.** There is no fee to HUBClub members for these measurements.
- **Trish is available to evaluate for CAA Level 1 Driver Proficiency including the Road Test.** Contact Lydia for more info.
- Per our insurance and bylaws, anyone actively involved with a horse at the clinic must be a HUBClub member. This includes drivers, grooms, certain volunteers, and anyone bringing a pony or VSE for measurement.
- Participants may clinic out of their trailer for a daily haul-in fee of \$10 or out of a permanent stall for a daily stall fee of \$25 (add \$10 if coming in the night before). Electrical hook-ups for overnight camping are also available upon special request. Bedding is not included and is NOT available for purchase on-site. Everyone is kindly asked to clean up after their horse when they leave whether hauling-in or using a stall.
- Anyone riding on a carriage must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use.
- A negative Coggins test dated within one year of the event is required. Out-of-state horses must present a Veterinary Health Certificate dated within 30 days of clinic.
- There are bleachers outside but your own chairs may be more comfortable. A hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, and bug spray are also recommended.
- Each person should bring their own lunches, drinks, and snacks. If the weather is nice, bring chairs and eat outside! Otherwise, as long as everyone maintains social distancing, we can eat in the clubhouse. Dinner TBD.
- No dogs allowed.
- We will be following the current State of Illinois/Kane County COVID-19 guidelines on the date of the clinic.

# How to Earn Awards Without Even Showing (in 2020)

## From the American Driving Society website:

“The ADS Driven Dressage Awards recognize drivers who have four tests per level with a score of 48 penalty points or below, or 70% or above. Drivers earn Medals and pins for each of the four levels:

- Blue Medal:** ADS Training Level Tests
- Bronze Medal:** ADS Preliminary Level Tests
- Silver Medal:** ADS Intermediate Level Tests and/or FEI 1\* Tests
- Gold Medal:** ADS Advanced Level and/or FEI 2\* or 3\* Tests (or equivalent = tests driven at FEI World Championships)

For many years the USDF has offered a Medal program to riders achieving certain scores at First, Second, and Third (Bronze); Fourth and Prix St. George (Silver); and Intermediate and Grand Prix (Gold). They even offer Bronze, Silver, and Gold BARS for Freestyles at the same levels!

In 2018, the American Driving Society introduced a similar program to its members. For a little background, carriage drivers can compete in driven dressage at a show expressly for this purpose, at a pleasure show, or

at a combined driving show. Regardless of the venue, there are only a few driven dressage tests available to drivers:

- Training A, B, and C
- Preliminary A, B, and C
- Intermediate A, B, and C (and FEI 1\* tests)
- (FEI 2\* and 3\* tests)
  
- Arena Trial Training A and B
- Arena Trial Preliminary A and B
- Arena Trial Intermediate A and B
- Arena Trial Advanced



(notice that the driven dressage tests are organized by eventing or combined test levels)

ADS members have enthusiastically embraced this awards program, with 35 members receiving 50 medals in the first “catch up” year of this program! In 2019, 12 members earned 15 medals, and in 2020, 8 members earned 11 medals.

At the time the ADS introduced this program, I didn't think Newman and I had high enough scores from recognized shows to medal, so didn't bother to actually check my scores. However, about a year after he passed, I was finally able to look through his competition folder. Lo and behold, by combining three Training Level scores with one Preliminary score, we had done it! Achieved a Blue Medal from the American Driving Society!

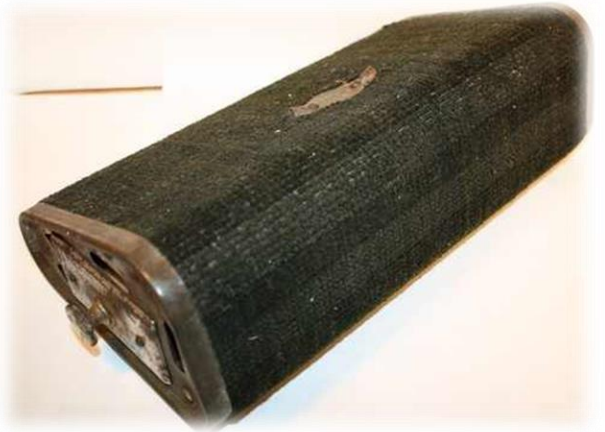
Scanning the four dressage tests (along with the show bills for each) and filling out the application form couldn't have been easier. And the person at the ADS responsible for verifying the scores and shows was super friendly and super-fast. I probably had my beautiful Blue Medal about a week after submitting the requirements!

I realize accumulating awards isn't for everyone. For me, it was yet another way to memorialize my "heart" horse and all his accomplishments – in ridden dressage, combined driving, hunters, even sidesaddle. But to the carriage drivers out there, if you've already done the work, why not find your old dressage tests and see if you have enough to earn some lovely recognition.

# Foot warmers



These are photos of an antique early 1900's Horse Carriage, Sleigh, Early Car or foot warmer with a metal slide out tray to put the Clark carbon coal brick in it and vents on the back and sides to let in more air to make the coals hotter. It was made by the "Chicago Flexible Shaft Co." It is called "The Clark Heater # 7 C". This heater keeps the feet of your passenger nice and warm.



The heater is 13 3/4" long, 4 3/8" high and 7 1/2" wide. It is heavy, about alone without a



brick is 6 lbs. The metal has a little surface rust, but no rust thru spots. This is covered with black carpet that has faded to green, which is in excellent condition considering its age. The wire handle on top is missing; the damper value rotates and works.

Below is a brief summary of the History of Carriage Heaters from the Carriage Museum of America. Probably the foot warmer that most people think about for carriages and sleighs was popular during the early 1900s. It was a metal container with carpet, which had a drawer on the end for inserting a special brick. The first

mention of this type that we found was in January 1877 (Hub) and in February, 1877 (Carriage Monthly). Both referring to a new foot warmer for carriages invented by Mr. Cassinelli, of Italy. This improved heater is made of heavy galvanized sheet-iron, either plain or ornamented, and is furnished with hot and cold air-chambers, and produces heat varying from 130 to 140 degrees Fahrenheit. The heat-generator consists of a patented compound, supplied in brick form, which is readily ignited and burns from six to ten hours. The brick is inserted in a receptacle that is suspended midway between the hot and cold air chambers, where it is firmly secured by a spring. The compound, while burning, gives off but little volatile matter, and consequently but little odor, which, it is claimed, is neither offensive nor unhealthy. Practical test shows this to be a fact. So far as regards the liability of setting fire to clothing or the carriage, there is not the least danger, as the fire is securely held in place, and the heater itself will not ignite even a friction-match when laid upon its exterior, as it will never reach a degree of heat greater than the hand can bear.

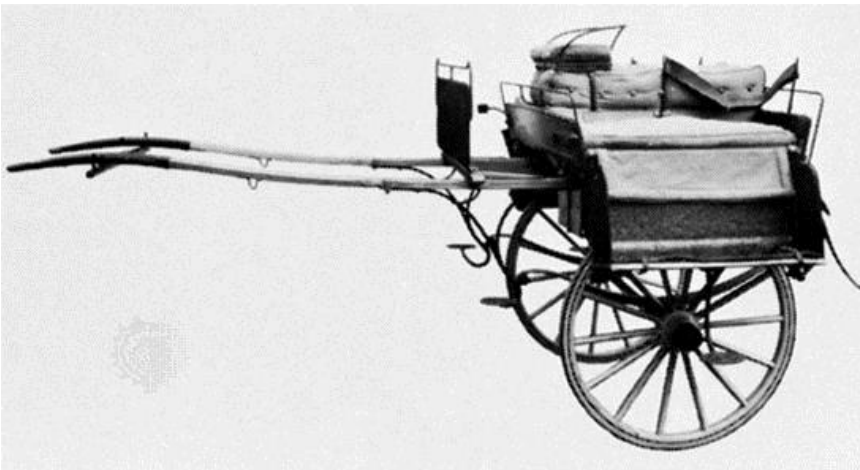
The heater is supplied in various sizes, the smaller sizes being nearly diminutive enough to use as pocket-heaters, and are so made that they may be carried by hand in a ventilated satchel, and placed under the feet when entering any public conveyance, such as a stage or railway-car. The cost of the brick, which lasts eight hours, is about eight cents, or one cent per hour. For some unknown reasons there does not seem to be any further mention of this type heater until November 1888 when we found an ad in the Sunnyside for the Halsted Foot Warmer they claimed there foot warmer would hold one brick of the Chemical Fuel, which would burn from 12 to 16 hours.

The Lehman's Heaters (first put on the market in 1885) were also advertised at this time with one piece of Lehman's Coal giving a continuous heat for ten hours at nominal cost of two cents. The genuine Lehman Coal can be extinguished with water and what is left used again. The Lehman Heater sold by Lehman Bros., of New York continued in popularity til the early 20th century. In 1900 the company claimed that 135,000 of its heaters were in use, with 10,000 heaters and 500,000 pieces of coal being sold annually.

The runner up in popularity to the Lehman heater seems to have been the Clark Heater made by Chicago Flexible Shaft Co., Chicago, Illinois. A press release by the company in 1902 states that they have recently perfected a new process for manufacturing carriage-heater coal, and have just completed a new and modern plant, equipped with the latest labor-saving machinery, for the turning out of this coal in the very largest quantities. With this new process the Chicago Flexible Shaft Co., guarantee every piece of coal they made to burn perfectly and to give 25% more heat than any other coal heretofore made. The guarantees were printed on each box. The Clark Carbon as it was known would give off a heat for 12 to 15 hours.

The carbon was prepared by a special process and was formed into brickettes under a hydraulic press, exerting a pressure of 50 tons to the square inch, after which all volatile gases were driven off by subjection to high temperature.

## Irish Jaunting cars



Irish Jaunting Cars were a cheap mode of transportation in Ireland. Passengers had no cover and sat on the outside of the vehicle sideways. Often, there was a channel in the middle for packages. Most were two wheeled with the occasional four wheeled one where more passengers were involved
